## Gradient Hearts

## Cross-stitch charts by $\mathfrak{L o o s e}$ ThreadStitchery

$\mathcal{A}$ pair of small and relatively simple projects to practice stitching colour gradients in blackwork. Both hearts use the same fill motif. Heart 1 has a horizontal gradient; Heart 2 has a diagonal gradient. Each chart measures 70 stitches wide by 60 stitches figh; stitched area is $60 \times 50$ stitches. Shown here on 14-count Aida and in 5 " hoops.

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## Notes

The blackwork fill is back-stitched using a single strand of embroidery floss. The hearts are outlined in stem-stitch using a double strand of embroidery floss. The models are shown on 14-count Aida and use the following colours of $\mathcal{D M C}$ thread:

Heart 1:

The following is worked as a single long stitch:


The gradients are created by repeating a fill motif and gradually replacing stitches of one colour with stitches of a second colour. I find it easiest to work all back-stitches of the starting colour first (for Heart 1, this is $\mathcal{D M C}$ 915; for Heart 2, it is $\mathcal{D M C} 3837$ ). I've included charts showing only these stitches so that you can see how the motiffades out in the starting colour. This is the most difficult part when it comes to keeping track of where you are in the chart; once the first colour is complete, you use the second colour to fill in the gaps in each motif.
